Students wishing to enter the program on the Miramichi apply directly to either St. Thomas University or the University of New Brunswick, indicating their intention to study on the Miramichi on the appropriate section of the standard university application form.

University Programs on the Miramichi

The first step on your academic journey is right outside your door.

University Programs on the Miramichi (UPM) is a university partnership which allows students from the Miramichi area to begin their university education in their own community.

A co-operative venture between the University of New Brunswick and St. Thomas University, the program provides students with the option of staying at home while they begin studies in liberal arts, science, or business/commerce.

Courses offered in the Miramichi program are taught by experienced, knowledgeable professors in small class sizes using the well-equipped facilities of NBCC Miramichi. After completing their studies locally, students normally transfer to UNB or STU to complete their bachelor's degrees in arts, science, or business.

Your Academic Opportunities on the Miramichi

UNB and STU work together to offer a selection of courses diverse enough to allow students to complete their first year of study. Courses are offered at various times throughout the week to accommodate different schedules. Most courses are eligible for transfer to either UNB or STU.

Faculty and Classes

Faculty members are knowledgeable in their fields and accessible to students. Class sizes are small (10-40 students), creating a personalized and dynamic learning environment.

Academic advising is available on campus to a student looking for advice or guidance on academic matters.

Miramichi Money Matters

Instead of an annual full-time tuition fee, students pay individual course fees directly to the universities on a per-course basis. There is also a small per-course fee for the local administration of the program.

Financing Your Education

Students enrolled in three or more courses each term are eligible for Canada Student Loans and other Revenue Canada Benefits.
