

MIRAMICHI'S RESIDENTIAL TAX RATE REMAINS SAME AS CITY COUNCIL APPROVES 2024 BUDGET

Miramichi City Council approved the City of Miramichi's 2024 budget at a special public council meeting on November 28. Council held three days of public deliberations on November 7, 14, and 21 before adopting the final budget which includes three separate budgets:

- Operating Budget funds municipal programs and services
- Utility Operating Budget- funds the provision of water and sewerage services
- Utility Capital Budget funds new construction as well as updates to existing infrastructure
- Capital Budget funds new construction as well as updates to existing infrastructure

"This budget is a reflection of the resources necessary to meet our service delivery requirements to both the current and future residents and businesses of the City of Miramichi," said city treasurer, Nancy Gorman.

"Further, it implements strategic plan priorities and supports investment into various initiatives."

She added significant pricing challenges, inflation, delivery delays on good and services continue to impact the operating and capital budgets of the City.

Highlights of the 2024 Utility Operating Budget (\$6.6 million)

- Budget has increased by \$91,147 from 2023
- No increase to water and sewerage rates in 2024. Water cost per cubic meter will remain at \$1.29. The residential sewerage flat rate will remain at \$99.03 per quarter.
- Average quarterly bill for family of 4 would be \$103.50 for water, \$99.03 for sewer for an average yearly billing of \$810.12

Highlights of the 2024 Utility Capital Budget (\$2.2 million)

\$1.3 million for Newcastle water system upgrade – continuing project \$550,000 for 2 street reconstruction projects \$250,000 for water meter replacement project – year 5

Highlights of the 2024 Operating Budget (\$43 million)

- The residential tax rate will remain the same at \$1.715 per \$100 of assessment.
- The residential tax rate in the former Nelson Local Service District will increase by 5 cents to \$0.608 per \$100 of assessment.
- The residential tax rate in the former Newcastle Service District will increase by 5 cents to \$0.664 per \$100 of assessment.
- Non-residential (commercial) tax rates and heavy industrial tax rate will be \$2.744 per \$100 of assessment, or 1.6 times the local residential rate.
- New positions created in the police department and community wellness and recreation departments.

Highlights of the 2024 Capital Budget (\$29 million)

- \$20 million for Miramichi Multiplex project
- \$5.4 million for road work and sidewalk replacements. Projects include annual resurfacing of city streets at \$2.5 million, \$650,000 for drainage, paving, and lighting of parking lot on Newcastle waterfront, \$550,000 for Phase 1 of design and construction of stormwater system in Kerr Park, and \$375,000 for new roadway development adjacent to the Multiplex site.
- \$2.4 million in improvements to parks, playgrounds and trails including \$550,000 for Active Transportation Plan - Southern Spine, \$753,000 for replacement of Ritchie Wharf dance floor, and \$300,000 for Harkins site development.
- \$878,000 in renewal/upgrades to equipment and buildings including \$65,000 for jaws of life, \$85,000 for body armour for Emergency Response Team, and funds to upgrade/replace a playground, improve lighting and drainage at baseball fields.
- \$590,000 in ongoing fleet replacement including replacement of vehicles for the fire and police departments, heavy equipment in the public works department, and a transit bus.
